

Welcome, Impact Partners, to the 2023 Annual Performance Report.

This report tells the story of a year of success that would not have been possible without the grace of God Almighty and your generous support. In 2023, your organization served more than 56,000 families with 115,000 services through family training on the Al-Aila platform, family counseling and conflict resolution through Al-Mawaddah Center for Family Counseling, the Makkah Center for Women's Empowerment, the Shaml Center for Separated Families, the Protection Center for Family Protection from Violence, the Edraak Center for Awareness Media Production, the Child Innovation Center, the Center for Family Studies and Research, and the Kafa'ah Center for the Development of Practitioners and Specialists.

Last year, the society launched many qualitative initiatives, including the the impact Laboratory for Family Development, which highlights the efforts and impact of family societys in community stability, as well as the award for the best supportive work environment for parents, in addition to the launch of the Tharwa Laboratory for Innovation in Family Development.

At the level of value-awareness media production, last year we produced the Mawaddah Family cartoon series, which was launched on MBC and the Shahid platform. More than 100 awareness-raising media products were also implemented, as well as 5 awareness-raising media campaigns that were watched by more than 20 million beneficiaries, and we are committed to developing this aspect. In the year 2024 because of its significant impact on society.

In terms of reaching the world, Al-Mawadda has translated its products into English, in addition to 398 awareness products, and also providing all its services in English for non-Arabic speakers. The society also obtained the approval of the World Family Organization to host the World Family Summit 2025, where it participated in the 2023 World Summit with the Al-Mawadda experience. The society also transferred its expertise in family issues outside the Kingdom to many government and non-profit organizations after the approval of the relevant authorities. We are still committed to continuous development in this regard in order to highlight the role of the Kingdom in serving family issues.

In conclusion, I would like to thank and appreciate all the supporters of the society, from donors to strategic partners, asking the Almighty God for continued success and guidance.



The impact of family societys in the Kingdom

We at Al Mawaddah society are proud to be one of the active societys in the family development sector in the Kingdom, which includes more than 155 societys. We also renew our commitment to our national duty and social responsibility after adjusting our geographical scope from the Makkah Al-Mukarramah region to all regions of the Kingdom. We are also proud of our contribution to enabling 32 family societys to implement government competitions that have generated revenues exceeding 15 million riyals.

Any society suffers from many family issues, such as a decrease in the number of births, a decrease in the number of marriages, an increase in the number of divorces, an increase in the number of family cases in the courts, family disintegration, and other issues that contribute to increasing the burden on the state. For example, cases of family conflict in Australia cost the state. About 14 billion pounds annually, and in Britain it costs 37 billion pounds annually, while domestic violence costs about 15.6 billion pounds annually.

Therefore, there is a major role for family societys in the Kingdom to stabilize society and reduce the burden on the state, as the coverage rate reached 257 thousand individuals per family society, 78 thousand families per society, and 39 thousand citizen families per society, and their services last year covered 25% of the population. The number of families in the Kingdom, and 50% of family societys spent about 380 million riyals on programs and services for the family and settled 35% of family cases received by the courts, with 97 thousand and 215 reconciliation cases. Family societys also contribute to the labour force index in the Kingdom by 0.23% and contributed Reducing divorce rates by 66%.

Today, we are in the process of issuing a national report highlighting the impact of family societys in the Kingdom, in partnership with the Family Affairs Council, the National Center for Non-Profit Sector Development, and the societys Support Fund. We are also working on preparing the first national indicator of family stability.


Progress has been achieved at the level of institutional and financial performance compared to previous years, while at the level of social performance, there was a decline of 3% from last year.

Performance according to key indicators






Performance according to the balanced scorecard

Comparing the targeted number of beneficiaries with the achieved number




Najwa's story


Najwa is a separated woman who benefits from social security and supports five children. She lost one of her children to drowning, which put her into a state of depression and she became unable to support her family and pay the family's needs of rent and electricity bills. Najwa received social and psychological support from the society and trained with the Makramah Center in a coordination course. She also received microfinance from the center and was employed in an international hotel. She also received housing support through the Safe Roof Project, and today she is able to support her family and a stable social life.

About the family platform

His Excellency the Minister of Human Resources and Social Development launched the Family Platform to train families to use electronic educational videos for marital preparation, family relations, education, family planning, financial planning, conscious motherhood, and planning for separation with grace. The platform contains more than 20 digital training courses in Arabic, English, and sign language.

The platform also provides electronic family counseling services, electronic psychological measurement testing services, and regularly carries out dialogue awareness evenings for the family to discuss critical family issues.

The platform also implements qualitative in-person training programs in partnership with many universities, schools, and government, military, and private sectors. Examples of this include the sound education program for mothers, the digital safety program for children, and the instilling values program to enhance family values for university and school students.


Fahd's story


Dania's story


Dania is a 15-year-old teenager who lives between two separated parents and is running away from her family due to multiple disputes with her parents over her custody and care. She has suicidal thoughts, behavioral and intellectual deviations, academic problems, and friends who support her to rebel against her family and run away from home. The specialists met with Dania and studied her case, and several counseling sessions were held for her to correct her thoughts and modify her behavior. She was included in psychological support groups, and educational programs were provided to the parents to take into account the age stage the daughter is going through and the importance of containing her. Today, Dania lives in a stable condition and understands the situation of her separated parents and contributes to raising awareness of the teenage girls in her surroundings. She appreciates the value of family in her life.

In partnership with the Ministry of Justice, we provide vision, visitation, and custody transfer services to separated families in the Makkah Al-Mukarramah region, which helps in enhancing and facilitating parents' seeing their children during the custody period or the period of conflict in a safe environment instead of police stations and judgment enforcement divisions. The program's services also include providing legal consultations to families. Separate, psychological preparation and progression services for children suffering from psychological disorders.



Sarah's story

Ahmed and Yasser are two children between the ages of seven and nine, who live between two separate parents. As a result of the constant conflicts between the parents and the lack of responsibility towards the children, which makes each party have children on the other side, and as a result, the two children were abandoned by leaving them in the street for two days. Shaml Center received the children and housed them through the Family Protection Center until they were handed over to a family member. The competent security authorities were also notified to take the necessary action against the parents. The situation of the two children was monitored and psychological support sessions were provided to them through the Family Guidance Center, and the parents were also obligated to attend a course on dealing with children after


Today, Ahmed and Yasser live with their father, their psychological condition is stable, and they visit their mother constantly.


Ibrahim, a child born with a severe intellectual disability in a family with a very low income and a broken family. The mother abandoned the family, and the father found himself forced to deal with his disabled son, so he locked him in an unfinished room with no personal hygiene. He tied him with short iron chains and relieved himself in the same place. A neighbor reported a case of domestic violence to the Protection Center, and the team visited the family's home and took him to the hospital. Then he was transferred to the residence of a family member, constantly following up on his condition and ensuring that he received treatment until his condition stabilized. Today, Ibrahim lives a safe and stable life.






Saeed's Story

The child, Saeed, was born in good health, and after he reached the age of one and a half years, his mother discovered that his sense of hearing had deteriorated due to a lack of interaction with sounds and then their absence. The child was diagnosed with hearing loss in both ears, and had a cochlear implant at the age of 4 in one ear due to his financial condition. He then began a speech therapy journey over the course of 6 years, until his mother noticed his lack of linguistic and speech development. His mother decided to visit the Innovative Child Center, and the necessary diagnosis was made along with assessing his condition, which revealed that the child was not subject to proper training and education. The treatment journey began in accordance with his needs, and his linguistic ability improved considerably.

The center aims to promote and build the child's skills to be a safe, psychologically and socially stable child




Comparing Revenues Classification for the Same Period with Previous Years





Growth of Investment Returns




Program Expenses Growth Index
